

Did You Know?

- Beginning July 1, 2012, California State Law requires all businesses that generate 4 or more yards of waste per week must incorporate recycling as part of solid waste services.
- Paper, which includes everything from packaging to mail, makes up the largest percentage of the municipal solid waste stream at 33 percent. It's also one of the most recovered materials, as recycling opportunities are often readily available.

Benefits of Paper Recycling

- Reduces greenhouse gas emissions that can contribute to climate change by avoiding methane emissions.
- Reduces energy required for a number of paper products.
- Saves considerable landfill space.
- Reduces energy and water consumption.
- Decreases the need for disposal

Recycling one ton of paper would:

- Save enough energy to power the average American home for six months.
- Save 7,000 gallons of water.
- Save 3.3 cubic yards of landfill space.
- Reduce greenhouse gas emissions by one metric ton of carbon equivalent (MTCE).



- White and colored paper

- Aluminum cans
- Paper bags
- Clean Aluminum foil
- Milk cartons
- Cereal/cracker boxes
- Tin cans
- Glass jars & bottles
